30% of the conversation

- What trends exist by subgroup (e.g., grade, gender, ELL, Sped)?
- How can we target supports for a particular subgroup?



Student Interventions



60% of the conversation

- Which students are struggling, and what do we know about them?
- What personalized supports can we provide?

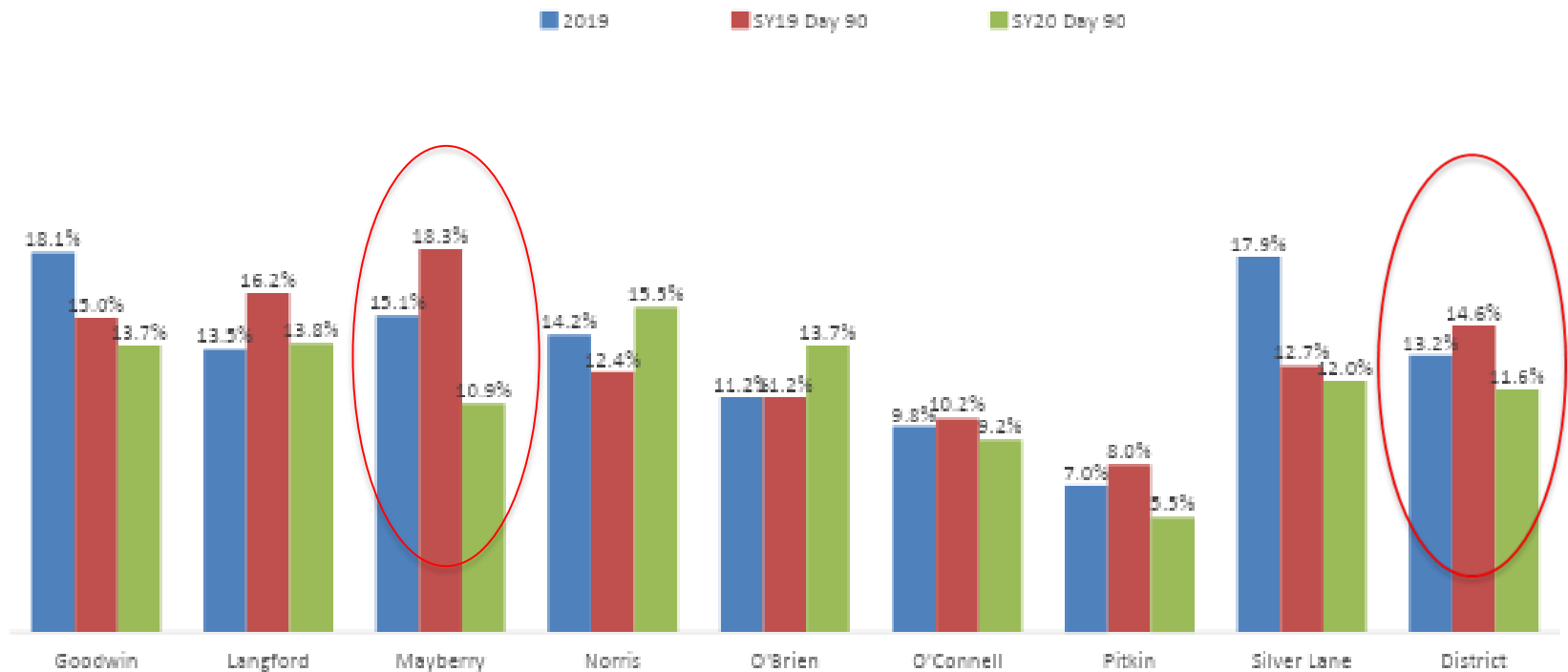


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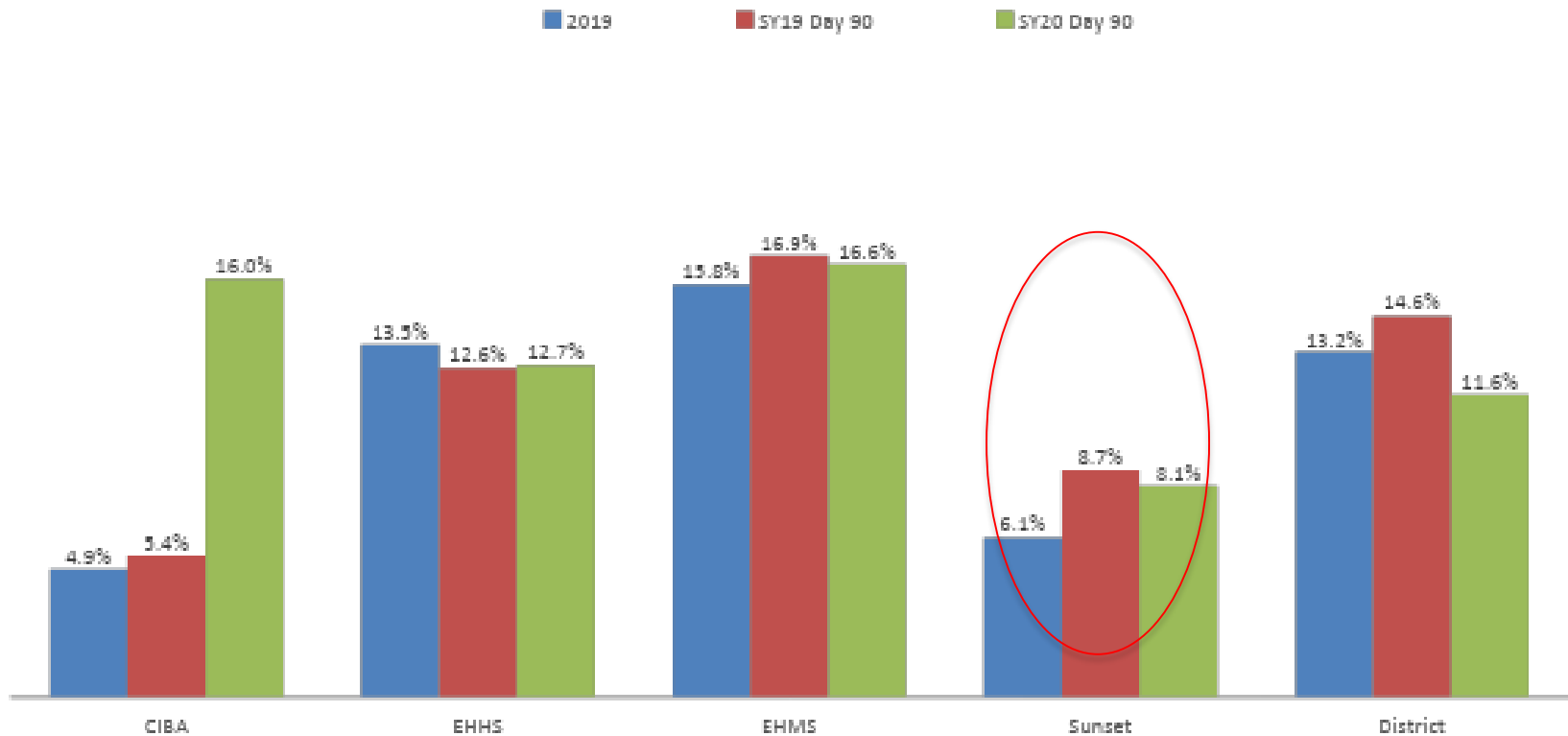

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EHPS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

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Help your child SUCCEED in school: Building the habit of good attendance

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make them feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.



FACT: Only 17% of Kindergarten and Grade 1 children who are chronically absent (20+ missed days) can read by Grade 3.
